### #2 – Aquafina Purified Drinking Water

- Easy to distribute individually
- Easy to store and carry in ice chest
- More ounces of water per bottle than #3
- Price per oz. is cheaper than #3
- Nearly \$3.00 per case cheaper than #3

### #3 – Ozarka Natural Spring Water

- Easy to distribute individually
- Easy to store and carry in ice chest
- 8 fl. oz. bottles could have less waste with children
- Price per bottle is cheaper than #2, but price per oz. is higher

### #4 – Deer Park Distilled Water

- Cheapest per oz.
- Difficult to distribute small portions to individuals – Need cups or glasses
- Storage in ice chest and storage area more difficult

### #1 – Perrier Sparkling Mineral Water

- Too expensive
- Must be purchased in individual bottles
